Current Policy Overview



DoHS sets billable days for school-age children based on monthly workdays

- Child must attend at least one day during the month to be eligible for a full monthly payment by enrollment
- Providers may bill by attendance if care exceeds billable days or occurs across multiple sites
- Providers must not deny access to children enrolled under subsidy

Current Policy Overview: Part-Day Attendance



Part-Day Attendance: Less than 4 hours

- Type 1: 1 minute 1 hour and 59 minutes
- **Type 2:** 2 hours 4 hours
 - Part days can convert toward full days. (e.g., 19 part days = 13 full days.) 13 full days = payment by monthly rate based on the child's age and parents' fee.

Why the Policy Is in Place



Federal policy prohibits payment for childcare during the hours that public schools are otherwise available. With the following exceptions:

- Illness
- Suspension
- Virtual Learning (public health crisis)
- Kindergarten readiness (not yet school eligible)

State childcare funding cannot overlap with federal education funds

Federal Requirements for Enrollment-Based Pay



Providers may not claim payment for children who remain on the roster but never attend

- Aligns with CCDF monitoring and audit standards
- Enrollment-based pay supports continuity of care while ensuring accountability

Ideas for New Policy



- Option 1: Reduce the number of hours considered a day
- Option 2: Implement a weekly attendance threshold
- Option 3: Reduce Part-Day Conversion Threshold from 13 to 10 days
